EMC Employee Donations Increase

Employee support through the payroll donation program has increased substantially each year.

"The employee payroll donor program began in 2007 with a handful of employees who donated \$733. In 2008, the numbers increased and donations jumped to \$3,174. As of 4/1/09 the 2009 pledge total has already reached \$6,451" commented Doreen Krabbenhoft, EMC Foundation Executive Director.

All employees at Elmore Medical Center are offered the opportunity to participate. The program is voluntary. Although a pledge drive is held each winter, employees can enroll in the program at any time during the year. They indicate how much they want to donate and how many payrolls to spread that over.

All donors have the option to designate what their contributions are used for or allow the Foundation Board to apply the funds to the greatest need. The Foundation maintains a permanent Endowment Fund and dedicated Scholarship Fund. The Annual Campaign funds are used to purchase an item from the hospital's capital equipment needs list. For 2009, the Foundation Board of Directors elected to purchase a new ventilator, needed to support the growing surgery program at Elmore Medical Center.

Board president, Larry C. Ashcraft, stated, "Elmore Medical Center has some of the most capable and dedicated employees in healthcare. The payroll donations are further indication of their efforts and desire to provide the best care possible to members of our community."

SW Idaho Combined Federal Campaign

2008 was the third year that Elmore Medical Center participated in the SW Idaho Combined Federal Campaign. This campaign allows military and federal employees the opportunity to donate to the charity of their choice through payroll deductions.

The campaign runs from October to December 15 each year. Donors make gift pledges during the campaign and donate through the course of the year through payroll deductions.

Foundation Awards Nursing Scholarships

Elmore Medical Center Foundation Board members presented a check for \$9867 to Dr. John Bideganeta, EMC Board of Trustees Chairman and Greg Maurer, EMC Administrator at the Foundation Board meeting on Thursday, September 25, 2008.

The money was raised at the Annual Golf Classic & Silent Auction held in August to purchase a new colonoscope for the Surgery Department. The equipment is used to perform colonoscopy procedures which allow for an examination of the entire colon. A common use for a colonoscopy is for the detection of signs of colon and rectal cancers.

The Annual Golf Classic is the main fundraising event organized by the Elmore Medical Center Foundation Board of Directors. The annual golf event has grown steadily from its beginning with 122 golfers participating in the 2008 event. The event features a silent auction that allows golfers and non-golfers an opportunity to purchase gift baskets and an assortment of additional donated items.

The community support received from local businesses, hospital vendors, EMC staff and golfers is greatly appreciated.

All proceeds from the Golf Classic are used to benefit Elmore Medical Center and provide needed funding to support local access to quality health care. In addition to the colonoscope donation, the Foundation Board invested \$3,289 from golf classic proceeds in the Foundation Endowment Fund to provide for future project and program funding.
